

Basketweave Scarf

Knit in a deep charcoal gray, this simple scarf makes a strong statement. The easy basketweave pattern is so addictive, you won't want to make just one.

INTERMEDIATE

Finished measurements

Approx 6½" x 60"/16.5cm x 152.5cm

Materials

- 2 3½oz/100g hanks (each approx 220yd/201m) of Cascade Yarns 220 Wool Heathers (Peruvian highland wool) in #8400 charcoal grey
- One pair size 7 (4.5mm) needles or size to obtain gauge

Note

Work each basketweave pat section very loosely. If it is pulling in too much, use a larger needle for that section only.

Scarf

Cast on 36 sts. Cont in pat sts as foll:

Rows 1 and 3 (RS) *K2, p1; rep from * to end.

Rows 2 and 4 *K1, p2; rep from * to end.

Rows 5–12 Knit.

Row 13 K4, *bring RH needle behind first st on LH needle and k 2nd st tbl (leave st on needle), then k first st, sl both sts from needle; rep from * to last 4 sts, end k4.

Row 14 K4, p1, *p 2nd st on LH needle (leave st on needle), then p first st, sl both sts from needle; rep from * to last 5 sts, end p1, k4.

Rows 15–20 Rep rows 13 and 14. Rep rows 5–20 24 times more, end with a WS row. Rep rows 1–4 once more. Bind off in rib pat.

Finishing

Block piece to measurements. ■

Gauge

22 sts and 27 rows to 4"/10cm over basketweave pat using size 7 (4.5mm) needles.

Take time to check gauge.
